A. Discussion, consideration, and possible action to amend Chapter 19 Public Utilities and other Enterprises, Article 1, Section 19-4 Deposit for Water Service
Ordinance No: 10.21.24 A, with an Emergency Clause.

Every applicant for water service shall make a deposit of One hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for Rental, Commercial and Residential water service, in addition to the twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) turn on fee per water service account established and shall not be granted such service until he shall have paid to the city clerk such deposit. The name under which such application is made shall be the responsible party for the meter. The deposit shall serve as a guarantee for the payment of charges for water service and other amounts owed to the city in connection with the water service. When a customer's water service is discontinued, the deposit or any part of such amount deposited which remains after all such charges and amounts due the city has been satisfied, shall be returned to the customer. (Ord. 378A, Sec. 2)

#### Amended to:

Every applicant for water service shall make a deposit of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for Rental, Commercial and Residential water service, in addition to the fifty dollar (\$50.00) turn on fee per water service account established and shall not be granted such service until he shall have paid to the city clerk such deposit. The name under which such application is made shall be the responsible party for the meter. The deposit shall serve as a guarantee for the payment of charges for water service and other amounts owed to the city in connection with the water service. When a customer's water service is discontinued, the deposit or any part of such amount deposited which remains after all such charges and amounts due the city has been satisfied, shall be returned to the customer. (Ord. 378A, Sec. 2)

C. Discussion, consideration, and possible action to amend Chapter 19 Public Utilities and other Enterprises, Article 1 Water Services, Section 19-4A Water Turn on Fee, Ordinance No: 10.21.24 B, with an Emergency Clause.

A fee of \$25.00 will be charged for the first time that a resident's water is turned off for non-payment. Upon the second occurrence the fee shall be \$45.00. For a third water shut off for nonpayment, the fee shall be \$65.00. This will be based on a 12-month period of turn-offs. An additional \$100.00 deposit, in addition to the \$65.00 will be required for habitual offenders.

## Amendment to:

Water Turn-on Fees and Turn Off Fees on resident's water for non-payment of \$75.00 Upon second occurrence fee shall be \$95.00. For the third water shut off for nonpayment, the fee shall be \$115.00. This will be based on a 12 Month period of turn offs. An additional \$150.00 deposit, in addition to the \$115.00 will be required for habitual offenders.
